

How to copy Garage Band files to your iPad

1. On your mac or PC, extract the downloaded file
 - On a Mac, double click, and a new extracted folder is created
 - On a Windows computer, RIGHT Click, and choose 'extract all files'
2. Connect your iPad to your mac or PC.
3. Open iTunes. If your iPad is connected a button should show up that says 'iPad' - click on that.
4. Go to 'Apps' in the menu along the top, then half way down the screen, you should see a box that has 'File Sharing' written above it, and lots of Apps listed in the box. Click on 'Garage Band' from that list. Then, Drag and drop files into the box on the right from finder (mac) or explorer (windows), then click 'done'.

5. After your iPad has finished copying the files across, disconnect it. Then on your iPad, start Garage Band. Then press the little '+' to start a new song, and choose 'copy from iTunes file sharing', and then you should be able to open the files, and access the audio files you need as well.
